Call to Order

• The March 24th, 2020 meeting of the NERAC Full Council was called to order by Chair Chief Jason Gilliland at 1:10pm. He asked for approval of the February 13th meeting minutes.

Project Updates

Active Shooter Training Kits

• The kits were delivered to Chief E. Shears of Merrimac PD last week.

Active Shooter Trainings

• Although the ALERRT Center has cancelled all classes through April, ALERRT has

- offered NERAC two offerings of the AAIR course that will provide an opportunity for the region's instructors to shadow ALERRT instructors.
- One offering will be held in Pepperell/Dunstable since it was included in the FFY19 plan, and the other course can be held elsewhere in the region. If any Council members would like to host the course, they were encouraged to contact MAPC directly.
- On a related note, the ATIRC class scheduled for May 6th 8th will likely be cancelled. MAPC is awaiting official confirmation from LSU and/or MEMA.

Portable Ventilators for Area Hospitals

- B. Klag submitted a request to reestablish the portable ventilator cache that has existed in the past.
 - Due to the time-sensitive nature of the request, the request is for approximately \$300,000.00 in FFY18 and FY19 funds, so that the equipment can be purchased immediately.
- A total of at least \$278,000.00 is needed to replace the 27 ventilators that were previously stored in hospitals across the region.
- There are several projects that can be eliminated from the FFY18 and FFY19 budgets to make room in the budget. MAPC provided the following lists to the Council:
