

Request for Homeland Security Preparedness Projects

Each year, the Northeast Homeland Security Regional Advisory Council (NERAC) receives an allocation of funding from the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) through the Executive Office of Public Safety and Security (EOPSS) to improve the capability for the 85 municipalities in the Northeast Region to prevent, respond to, and recover from acts of terrorism and other public safety emergencies. As part of NERAC's strategic budgeting process for the upcoming federal fiscal year (FFY2021), the Council has elected to solicit project ideas from the whole community for inclusion in the budget.

If you have a project idea that you would like to have funded for the region, please use the form on page 2 to explain and justify the project. Projects will be evaluated based on the scoring matrix shown on page 4. Eligible projects may include trainings, exercises, equipment purchases, consulting services, planning efforts, and infrastructure development.

In order to be considered, all projects MUST:

- 1. Provide a regional benefit to a minimum of three (3) municipalities.
- 2. Have a clear nexus to homeland security/anti-terrorism (projects may serve a dual-purpose of improving preparedness for natural disasters as well as acts of terrorism, but must have a clear connection to terrorism).
- **3.** Have the primary purpose of supporting homeland security needs for non-routine events, rather than day-today operational needs.

PLEASE NOTE:

Due to limited funding, NERAC may require that funding requests of over \$15,000.00 be justified either in writing or in person to the Council. If your organization or municipality plans to submit a request for more than \$15,000.00, please be prepared to provide a written statement or make a brief presentation at the following meeting (see below) justifying the expense. Even if additional information is requested by the Council, the Council reserves the right to partially fund or reject any and all requests.

- In order to qualify for funding, organizations or municipalities receiving NERAC funding must be able to demonstrate that the Massachusetts Tactical Channel Plan has been implemented into their radio systems, to the extent possible based on the technical capabilities of their system. If needed, NERAC can offer the services of experienced COMLs and COMTs to assist with reprograming efforts.
